



Cleaning & maintenance of oiled floors

Protecting the oiled floor

Place felt mats under chairs and tables. Never place plants direct onto a wooden floor; always use a pot stand or dish. Placing iron subjects onto an oak floor may cause black stains.

Dry-cleaning of the floor

Preferably remove loose dirt with a vacuum cleaner. Any remaining grains of sand may cause scratches in the surface. Only dry-clean the newly oiled floor during the first 14 days and remove any spilled liquids immediately.

Wet cleaning of the floor

Mop stubborn dirt away with WOODlife Parquet Cleaner. Mix approximately 100 ml Parquet Cleaner with 10 liters of clean water and clean the floor with a well squeezed mop. Allow the floor to dry completely before walking on it. Specific stains can be treated locally by applying the undiluted parquet cleaner with a piece of cloth. Make sure to remove any excess parquet cleaner after rubbing the stain.

Maintenance of the floor

Depending on the intensity of use, treatment with WOODlife Maintenance Oil must be carried out regularly in order to keep the floor in optimum condition. Use white maintenance oil for white oiled floors, 'natural' for darker shades, and 'worn' for grayish looking floors. First thoroughly clean the floor with WOODlife Parquet Cleaner (see wet cleaning of the floor) and allow it to dry completely. Apply WOODlife Maintenance Oil to small areas in an even layer with a cloth with the grain of the wood.

For larger areas we recommend using a buffing machine: dribble the Maintenance Oil in the shape of a snake and polish it in with a buffing machine with a thick white pad.

- 1 liter of Maintenance Oil is sufficient for approximately 70 to 100m².
- Drying time: 6 to 12 hours (depending on temperature and ventilation).
